TTOS is pleased to announce that the Buckeye Police Department will be hosting a Level I Tactical Tracking Course (TTC-01) from January 29 – February 2, 2018, and Level II Tactical Tracking Course (TTC-02) from February 5 – 9, 2018

The TTOS Tactical Tracking Course is dynamic and fast paced visual tracking based course designed to train law enforcement personnel's visual perception, cognitive abilities to detect, analyze, collect and follow visual cues created by the passage or movement of personnel, vehicles, or animals through an area, scene or any tactical environment. Students will be able to detect and interpret evidence left on the ground (footwear, tire impressions, action indicators), correctly identify evidence related to the person being sought, correctly process and photograph the evidence for use in criminal investigations/prosecution. The new skill set enables LEO's to detect the slightest of visual cues and logically connect them to the subject that left them through both inductive and deductive reasoning, also referred to as "tactical tracking." This skill will enhance law enforcement personnel abilities to locate and identify suspects, discover and collects evidence, and locate missing or injured parties.









This training is ideal for state, county, municipal, tribal and federal agents that work or operate in rural environments, high crime areas, and austere environments (high intensity drug areas, trans-national smuggling areas, or narcotics cultivation and manufacturing areas). Training will increase operational effeteness with; rural crime scene processing, fugitive recovery/manhunting operations, network targeting and interdiction, resource violation investigations, and search and rescue operations. This course is suitable for patrol officers, tactical teams, filed agents, and supervisory staff.

Tactical Tracking Course (TTC) lesson plan will cover and be given hours of individual credit, including but not limited to:

- Basic land navigation, terrain profiling and association
